For the past 2-3 years, I have been working with the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) on several initiatives/legal cases including (1) fighting for safe drinking water, helping states lead the way in reducing pollution, implementing/promoting carbon capture technology/practices, protecting our forests from illegal logging, and supporting farmers grow healthy food through sustainable/regenerative agriculture.

For the past 2-3 years, I have been working with the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) on the Climate & Clean Energy Program, Water & Agriculture, Nature Program and Water Protection Program.

If elected or re-elected what specific environment, climate change, biodiversity, and environmental justice legislation will you prioritize and champion?

I will prioritize and champion legislation that addresses (1) salmon recovery efforts - this means ensuring that habitats are protected and investing in clean water infrastructure; (2) spill prevention by providing resources and funding for rapid, effective responses to any hazardous material spills, and (3) reduction in greenhouse gases such as encouraging clean-fuel vehicles (and other transportation services e.g. ferries) and carbon capture practices.
