Co-founding Mason County Climate Justice, serving on the monitoring team for the WA Climate Assembly, serving on Front and Center's Policy Committee, building bridges between different parts of the climate movement, direct action, supporting local food forests, fundraising for the climate justice movement, volunteering on habitat restoration and water quality monitoring projects, public comment, bill amendment suggestions, solar panel installation for low-income homeowners, and providing community education on the climate crisis and policy.
