If elected or re-elected what specific environment, climate change, biodiversity, transportation, building and land use, growth management, and/or environmental justice legislation will you prioritize and champion?

I will prioritize comprehensive climate action legislation that aims to drastically reduce carbon emissions, invest in renewable energy, and promote sustainable land use practices. Additionally, I will advocate for the protection of biodiversity through the preservation of natural habitats and stricter regulations on pollutants. My focus will also include expanding public transportation options to reduce our reliance on fossil fuels and implementing policies that ensure equitable access to clean air and water for all communities, particularly those disproportionately affected by environmental injustices.

Washington State law sets a target of 90.5 million metric tons (MMT) carbon pollution by 2020, but greenhouse gas emissions rose last year to 102 MMT (Department of Ecology). The state is not on-track. For state office positions, what action will you take to accelerate efforts towards Washington State's 2030 Climate goals, specifically a 45% reduction of carbon pollution below 1990 levels?

I will support legislation that promotes energy efficiency in buildings, expands the use of electric vehicles, and invests in renewable energy infrastructure. Collaboration with local governments, businesses, and community organizations will be key to creating a unified approach to achieving these ambitious targets.
